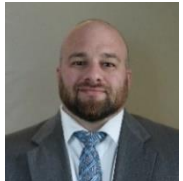
Ross Bernstein

Special Agent, Cyber Crime Unit, Louisiana Bureau of Investigation

David Ferris has been a law enforcement officer for 18 years. He has specialized in cybercrimes and technology facilitated child exploitation for the last 13 years. He currently serves as special agent with the Louisiana Bureau of Investigations, Cyber Crime Unit. He has conducted thousands of hours of instruction and investigation in online undercover operations. He has trained local, state, federal and international law enforcement officers conducting online investigation in the areas of online solicitation, human trafficking, dark web investigations and advance Peer to Peer Networks. He a nation Dark Web instructor for Police Technical. He has been certified as an expert in Undercover Peer to Peer investigations, Cybercrimes, and Child exploitation in numerous courts and boards throughout the state of Louisiana.

Presentation: The Dark Web, Law Enforcement Response to Cyber Crime

While most of the public is accustomed to Google and common social media platforms such as Facebook or Twitter, Law Enforcement officials are seeing criminals turning to the Internet. On the Dark Web, subjects are increasingly involved in child exploitation, narcotics trafficking, counterfeit software, and the exchange of restricted goods. We will discuss each level of the web, from the surface (Google) down to the "deep" and "dark". We will uncover the criminal offenses and investigative techniques to locate, identify and investigate individuals who are using the dark web to facilitate illegal activities.



Marty Parker

Special Agent, Child Exploitation/Human Trafficking Squad, Federal Bureau of Investigation

Marty Parker has been a Special Agent with the FBI for 22 years. She has worked Children Exploitation cases, including child abductions, child sex tourism and human trafficking, in Oakland, California for almost her entire career. She also spent 1 1/2 years at FBI Headquarters where she led the FBI's Child Abduction Rapid Deployment Team (CARD). SA Parker coordinates the Bay Area Child Exploitation/Human Trafficking Task Force and is also a field coordinator for the FBI's Behavioral Analysis Unit (BAU). She has provided instruction across the US and internationally on such topics as Behavioral Analysis, Child Abduction Response, and Human Trafficking.

Presentation: Child Abduction Response

This presentation is designed to provide the critical initial actions to law enforcement professionals responding to a report of a missing or abducted child. The instructor will provide case examples and discuss the FBI's Child Abduction Response Plan (CARP), sex offenders, and best practices. The instructor will also discuss the many resources the FBI can provide for these cases.

Zenia M. Patrick is a Management and Program Analyst in the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Presentation: Preparing for an FBI SOR Audit

In this presentation, participants will learn the importance of NCIC and the basics of the FBI NCIC SOR audit methodology. Audit findings using OffenderWatch NCIC will be discussed, and practical tips will be provided for reducing rejections and required validation.
